# About the competition

Fix Your Content Day 2025 is a 24-hour, worldwide competition where institutions come together to improve the accessibility of their digital course content using <a href="Anthology">Anthology</a>® Ally. Every fix—big or small—helps create a more inclusive learning environment for your students, while showcasing your institution's commitment to accessibility.

Last year, participants made nearly 42,000 fixes—this year, let's go even further! Be part of a worldwide movement to turn insight into action.

# How does the competition work?

- Register: Enter the competition by <u>registering</u> your institution. Then get ready to receive event updates!
- 2. **Rally:** In the days leading up to **November 18**, mobilize your campus for the competition, plan strategies, and prepare for the event.
- 3. **Fix:** During the 24 hours of the event, do your best to fix as many digital files as possible using Anthology Ally.
- 4. **Celebrate:** Track progress on the <u>global</u> <u>leaderboard</u>. Share the good news within your campus community and spread the word about the great work you've done as part of your commitment to accessibility and inclusion.

## How does the day work?

- Participants fix digital files using Anthology Ally. A "fix" is when the accessibility score of a file is improved.
- Each fix is recorded in the Anthology Ally database\* and will be reported via a live leaderboard containing "unofficial" results.
   Also, all fixes made using the Instructor Feedback for WYSIWYG will contribute to the total number of fixes for your institution.
- 3. The Ally team will track fixes in real time, and participants can check fixes through the usage report in the Ally Institutional Report.
- 4. After the challenge, the Ally team will validate the results\*\*, and the final winners will be announced a week after the event.

<sup>\*</sup> To be counted in the competition, fixes must be made through the Ally user interface.

<sup>\*\*</sup> To account for institution size, each one is ranked by its total number of files improved out of its total number of students

## Strategies for success

- Images are typically regarded as the "easiest" and fastest file type to improve because descriptions can be added directly through the Instructor Feedback panel
- Uploading a fixed file through the Ally Instructor Feedback panel also results in an improved score
- A file does not have to reach 100% accessibility to be counted as a "fix." Any and all improvements are positive progress!
